Manchester Assessment of Caregiver-Child Interaction (MACI-Infant) training

20-22 September 2017

3-day workshop, post-workshop practice & reliability

Trainer: Dr Ming Wai Wan

Venue: University of Manchester, UK

The MACI-Infant is a validated global rating measure of videotaped caregiver-infant interaction, suitable for studying normative and at-risk groups (3-15 months).

The training includes 3 days in-person training on the MACI-Infant, substantial coding practice to consolidate learning with feedback on up to 3 sets of clips, and a 2-part reliability assessment*. Feedback on a play interaction video recording is also included (optional). All materials, lunch and refreshments are included in the fee.

Suitable for: Researchers working with infants who wish to evaluate caregiver-infant interaction in infants aged 4 to 15 months.

*We recommend that the final reliability assessment is submitted within 6 months of the workshop, and we stipulate that all of the training must be completed *within* 1 year of the workshop if you wish to become a reliable coder. Applicants are asked to consider their other work commitments before applying.
