Current Funded Studies (Progress Updates)

The **THRIVE** study: **T**rial of **H**ealthy Relationship *I*nitiatives for the Very Early years; led by Dr. Marion Henderson and funded by NIHR Public Health Research (http://thrive.sphsu.mrc.ac.uk/).

Progress update: THRIVE is now on the home stretch. We have been busy coding videos (thanks to Charlotte Garrett who is now on maternity leave, and Cathy Shone). We welcome Amber and Sabina to the team to assist in the coding of the videos using a new method (the Mellow Parenting Observation System; MPOS), which assesses positive and negative interactions between parent and child.

The **IMAGINE** study: Enhancing maternal and infant wellbeing: A feasibility trial of the Baby Triple P Positive Parenting Programme for mothers with severe mental health difficulties; led by Dr Anja Wittkowski and funded by the NIHR RfPB.

Progress update by Paula Duxbury: Recruitment to the intervention part of the IMAgINE study ended on 30 April 2018 with 34 mothers randomised to receive treatment as usual (TAU) or TAU + Baby Triple P. All mothers have completed the intervention, and we have interviewed 7 of them about their experiences of Baby Triple P. We are currently interviewing staff at the two sites (Manchester and Birmingham; 11 interviewed so far) about their insights into all aspects of the study. We are looking forward to completing the quantitative and qualitative analyses and being able to share our findings very soon (by April 2019).
